1. CALL TO ORDER AND FLAG SALUTE

<u>Chair Dursse</u> called a meeting of the Board of Directors of Astoria School District No. 1C, Clatsop County, to order at 7:30 P.M. on Wednesday, January 14, 2015 in the Astoria School District Boardroom. All present stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. *COMMUNITY RECOGNITION

<u>Chair Dursse</u> read a statement of appreciation recognizing <u>Chad Rankin</u> of Columbia Memorial Hospital's Orthopedic and Sports Medicine Athletic Training program. He emphasized <u>Mr. Rankin's</u> consistent dedication to our kids and families and praised him for his expert, on the spot, medical advice and suggestions for proper treatment. <u>Chair Dursse</u> presented <u>Mr. Rankin</u> with a certificate of appreciation.

3. AHS STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE

Ms. Haley Korff reported on the most recent events taking place at Astoria High School including:

5. CONSENT AGENDA

The following consent agenda items were presented:

<u>DIRECTOR RICKENBACH</u> MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS AS PRESENTED AND <u>DIRECTOR HELLIGSO</u> SECONDED. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

6. REPORTS

A. ASTOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Students from Astor School were in attendance at tonight's meeting to share what they've been learning at school. They talked about ways to portray "Safe, Respectful, Responsible" behaviors and distributed "Pilot Points" to the deserving members. They went on to explain how they can use their earnings to purchase special items and privileges. Before exiting, the children gifted "vintage" Astor School t-shirts to the members in recognition of School Board Appreciation Month.

<u>Superintendent Hoppes</u> highlighted key areas of the board and district goals information included in the board packet.

C. ENROLLMENT

<u>Superintendent Hoppes</u> reported that there is a very limited amount of days between meetings, but enrollment is down by four students from mid-November through the end of December. He added that class sizes are still looking really good.

D. FINANCIAL

<u>Superintendent Hoppes</u> presented the financial report as <u>Ms. Kallstrom</u> was not in attendance at tonight's meeting. He referenced page 19 of the packet, noting that the balance left to spend was at 70% and the range average for this time of year is 71% which is right on target. He noted that the sub-finance committee already met and will meet again at the end of January.

E. GIFTS TO THE DISTRICT

<u>Chair Dursse</u> read the Gifts to the District report and thanked the donors for their generosity.

F. FOOD SERVICE

Ms. Bovard was in attendance at tonight's meeting to answer questions about the food service report. Superintendent Hoppes noted that there was a 7% increase in lunch participation compared to last year. Ms. Bovard said the reason may be that more meal varieties are being offered.

<u>DIRECTOR HELLIGSO</u> MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE POLICIES BBFA, BBFB AND GBC AS PRESENTED AND <u>DIRECTOR RICKENBACH</u> SECONDED. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

D. POLICY EEACA – SCHOOL BUS DRIVER EXAMINATION AND TRAINING (SECOND READING)

Change would require a physical examination be administered by a medical examiner listed in the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's National Registry of Certified Medical Examiners, rather than one that is not listed, as part of the school bus driver selection process.

<u>DIRECTOR HELLIGSO</u> MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE POLICY EEACA AS PRESENTED AND <u>DIRECTOR LAMAN</u> SECONDED. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

E. POLICY GBNA/JFCF –

 $\label{lem:hazing/Harassment/Intimidation/Bullying/Menacing/Cyberbullying} \\ (Second Reading)$

Adds "Cyberbullying" to the title.

<u>DIRECTOR RICKENBACH</u> MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE POLICY GBNA/JFCF AS PRESENTED AND <u>DIRECTOR LAMAN</u> SECONDED. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

F. POLICY GBN/JBA – SEXUAL HARASSMENT (SECOND READING)
Clarifies off duty conduct which is incompatible with district job responsibilities.

<u>DIRECTOR HELLIGSO</u> MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE POLICY GBN/JBA AS PRESENTED AND <u>DIRECTOR RICKENBACH</u> SECONDED. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

G. POLICY JGAB – USE OF RESTRAINT AND SECLUSION (SECOND READING) Includes added requirements as outlined in OAR 581-021-0568 although the District does not currently have a seclusion room.

<u>DIRECTOR RICKENBACH</u> MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE POLICY JGAB AS PRESENTED AND <u>DIRECTOR HELLIGSO</u> SECONDED. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

9. NEW BUSINESS

A. NWRESD LOCAL SERVICE PLAN

<u>Superintendent Hoppes</u> reminded the members that the local service plan comes before the Board annually for approval. He explained that county superintendents meet in the fall to determine how money for core services and credits through the ESD will be spent. He went on to say that previously, there have been minimal changes to the plan, although this year, money allotted for professional services provided by the ESD will now be spent by the districts.

<u>DIRECTOR HELLIGSO</u> MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE NWRESD LOCAL SERVICE PLAN AS PRESENTED AND <u>DIRECTOR LAMAN</u> SECONDED. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

B. DIVISION 22 STANDARDS

<u>Superintendent Hoppes</u> reviewed the Division 22 Report to the Community with the Board. He noted the following two areas in which the District is out of compliance:

- 1350 Alternative Education Programs the District is required to conduct an annual evaluation of the program
- 1620 Required Instructional Time Juniors and Seniors do not meet instructional time obligations as they are not required by the District to attend tutorial classes on Tuesdays & Thursdays (they are not assigned to formal classes)

<u>Superintendent Hoppes</u> noted that the District will conduct an evaluation of the alternative education program and present it to the Board annually.

Administrative staff will assess and modify the high school schedule to ensure instructional hour requirements are met. <u>Superintendent Hoppes</u> will bring this topic back to the members at a later time for discussion.

C. AMS FIELD TRIP – WASHINGTON D.C.

Mr. Hensley was in attendance at tonight's meeting to talk about the proposed field trip to Washington D.C. for Astoria Middle School students. He noted that this is an annual trip that has been going on for the past 25 years. Students will host four fundraising events to help offset costs.

<u>DIRECTOR LAMAN</u> MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE AMS WASHINGTON D.C. FIELD TRIP AND <u>DIRECTOR RICKENBACH</u> SECONDED. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

D. WARRANTY DEED – TRANSFER OF WARREN FIELD TO CMH
Superintendent Hoppes informed the members that the previous Warranty Deed approved at the last meeting was missing two parcels. They have since been added to the document and reviewed by the attorneys of all parties.

<u>DIRECTOR HELLIGSO</u> MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE WARRANTY DEED TRANSFER OF JOHN WARREN FIELD TO CMH AS PRESENTED AND <u>DIRECTOR LAMAN</u> SECONDED. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

E. BARGAIN AND SALE DEED (TRANSPORTATION PROPERTY)
This document was brought to the Board at the last meeting but lacked the two additional parcels.

<u>DIRECTOR RICKENBACH</u> MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE BARGAIN AND SALE DEED TRANSFER OF THE TRANSPORTATION PROPERTY TO CMH AS PRESENTED AND <u>DIRECTOR HELLIGSO</u> SECONDED. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

F. BILL OF SALE – WARREN FIELD/TRANSPORTATION PROPERTY

Superintendent Hoppes explained that the Bill of Sale is a requirement of the original four-party agreement. He visited the sites earlier this week with CMH staff to specify which remaining articles belonged to the District and those that will stay with the property.

<u>DIRECTOR HELLIGSO</u> MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE BILL OF SALE DOCUMENT AS PRESENTED AND <u>DIRECTOR LAMAN</u> SECONDED. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

G. SURPLUS PROPERTY - TECHNOLOGY

<u>DIRECTOR HELLIGSO</u> MADE A MOTION TO SURPLUS THE TECHNOLOGY ITEMS AS PRESENTED AND <u>DIRECTOR RICKENBACH</u> SECONDED. THEM MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.
