Dear Parents and Community Members, Astoria Middle School is not receiving a ranking this year as the state is not issuing rankings due to new testing with Smarter Balanced. School ratings have been historically determined using the percent of points earned for each of the indicators. The indicators are: academic achievement, academic growth, sub group growth in the areas of reading and math, and participation. 95% of the students participated in the Smarter Balanced assessment in the 2014-2015 school year. The data we received indicates the population at AMS has performed above the state average in both reading and math. When the subgroup data is reviewed you will see we also performed

higher than the state average for most of the reporting groups in both reading and math. We are pleased to see growth in our students learning, but are continuing to focus on increasing learning and providing equitable education opportunities to all our students.

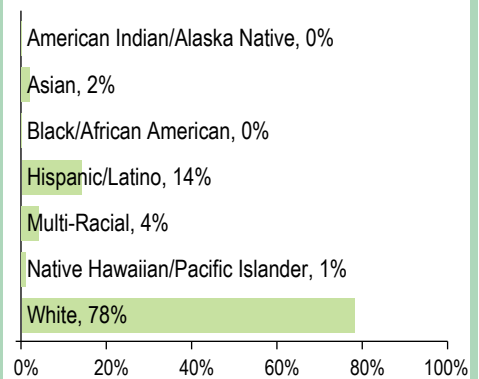

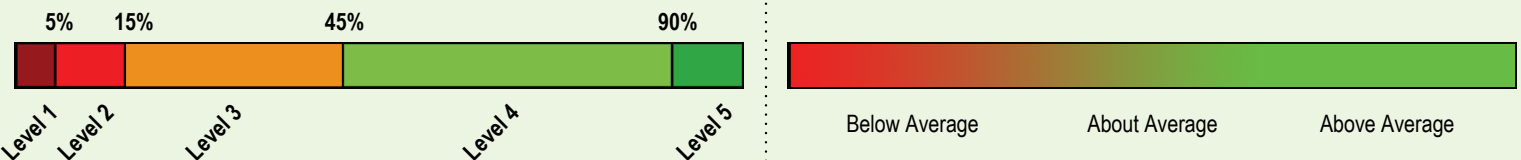

CURRICULUM & LEARNING ENVIRONMENT WHAT IS THIS SCHOOL DOING TO IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING AND TO PREPARE STUDENTS FOR THE FUTURE?

SCHOOL READINESS

Astoria Middle School teaches a comprehensive year long program to all incoming students to address emotional needs, healthy life choices, and safety. In the 7th and 8th grades students receive additional instruction through the wellness class. PE is offered to all students. PBiS is used

throughout the building to reinforce desired behavior and teach expected behaviors. The school rules are respectful, responsible and safe behavior across all setting

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

At Astoria Middle School we are able to provide a period each day to offer enrichment activities or intervention programs to address the learning needs of struggling learners. All grade levels have a math intervention class, reading support through title I and a study skills class to address school skills as well as behavior supports needed. In addition there is an after school math program is in place two days a week with an active peer tutoring program supporting the learning. We have three special education classrooms and an ELL program to address learning needs for our students with special needs or language learners.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

Astoria Middle School has many opportunities for student enrichment offered through our enrichment and intervention period. The programs include the following: Band, Orchestra, Choir, Numerology or fun with numbers, Leadership, Technology, Astoria Middle School Magazine Class, Think Lab (Zombie Science), Film and History, 20th Century Movie Studio Music, dance and movement, Math Study Hall, Maker Lab, Astoria Culture, Fiber Arts, DRAMATIC ARTS, Math with Your Hands, Express Yourself with Art, and SHARP Study Hall And Reading Pleasure. 85% of AMS students are participating in enrichment classes. In addition to the enrichment classes a semester of Spanish and a semester of Art is provided to all 7th and 8th grade students. Advanced math courses are provided to 6th through 8th grade studnets as well as a honors English class. We have an active Builders Club meeting after school through out the year working on service learning projects.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

At Astoria Middle School tech instruction is embedded in the core content classroom instruction. Computer labs and computer carts are used across all settings

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES/ AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Astoria middle school offers sports programs throughout the school year for 6th through 8th grades. We have opportunities for students to participate in Builders Club, Peer Tutoring and Marching band for 8th grade.
